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




Poverty rates

✓ roads, drainage, green



Why SDGs?





Major urban problems & challenges:

- Uncontrolled development;
- Traffic congestion;
- Road accidents;
- Environment deterioration;
- Disaster vulnerability



Why SDGs?

- Lao PDR commitment to SDGs is through its 8th NSEDP implementation (2015-20);
- Economic development shall be in harmony with:
 - ✓ socio-cultural and environmental protection;
 - ✓ disaster prevention and responses,
 - ✓ strong link of rural development to poverty reduction;
- MPWT identified 44 development programs for 2016 2020, including:
 - ✓ to reduce development gaps between urban centers and rural hinterland;
 - ✓ to diminish ecological, environmental and social pressure to existing urban areas.
 - ✓ to achieve balanced regional and local development;

The way forward

Plans of actions on urban-rural linkages:

- Identification of growth centers in rural areas (potential rural villages to carry out urban functions);
- Comprehensive territorial planning in identified growth centers;
- Securing transport linkages; and
- Fund support in line with NSEDP for infrastructure and elements of basic services.

The ways forward Comprehensive territorial planning principles:

 Integrated and participatory planning approach;

- Adequate, safe and affordable transport, houses and basic services,
- Accessible green areas, saving energy, low carbon production, reducing waste and waste water;
- Disaster prevention and climate change adaptation;
- Social inclusiveness, cultural and heritage protection.
