



Road infrastructure expansion rate in EST economies





Urban rapid transit infrastructure expansion rate in EST economies



Facilitate inclusive multi-modal national (including rural urban) and regional (cross-border) connectivity






Road infrastructure availability in Asia-Pacific




RESILIENCE GAP – CONNECTIVITY AT RISK

Expected annual damages to road and rail infrastructure due to hazards per kilometer

















