A new political corridor to achieve SDGs through water: From Bandung Spirit Water Summit to UN 2026 Water Conference

on 12 July 2024 at 13:15-14:30

1. Background and objectives

The Bandung Spirit Water Summit, an agora by incumbent and former Heads of State and Government, was organized at the 10th World Water Forum in May 2024, and focused on three key areas of water urgency, namely climate change and water resilience, sanitation and water for all, and water for peace.

In April 1955, the Asian-African Conference, also known as the Bandung Conference, was held in Bandung, Indonesia. The conference adopted the Ten Principles of Peaceful Coexistence, based on the Bandung Spirit, underpinned by the regions' commitment to mutual recognition, respect, and tolerance for diversity. As envisaged in the Bandung Conference, the Global South is expected to play a leading role in the international community in the coming years of the 21st century.

Against this backdrop, the Bandung Spirit Water Summit discussion addressed their collaboration with all stakeholders to accelerate global efforts to fundamentally address complex water issues. The outcomes from the summit will inspire further discussions in the relevant UN meetings, including HLPF, the One Water Summit, UN Water Conferences, COP 29, and further and collectively contribute to building a more comprehensive peace-building process from the water sector.

The objective of this side event is to share the outcomes of the Bandung Spirit Water Summit and discuss how to pave pathways towards resilient and sustainable world through water based on the outcomes.
