ILO and the Jaipur Declaration

Jaipur Declaration Goals:

- Promote 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle)
- Foster circular economy transitions
- Create green jobs and sustainable livelihoods

ILO's alignment through the Decent Work Agenda:

- The Decent Work Agenda has 4 focus areas; Employment Creation, Social Protection, Rights at Work and Social Dialogue
- Green jobs in waste and resource management
- **Skills training** for circular economy sectors
- Support for inclusive and just transitions





ILO in the Pacific

Active in 11 Pacific Island Countries (PICs)

Focus areas in relation to the Circular Economy and Decent Work:

- Decent work and sustainable livelihoods
- Skills development and green jobs
- Social protection and inclusive growth
- Policy Development and alignment

Strategic alignment with SDGs, ABAS 2024–2034, the Jaipur Declaration and the **2050** Strategy for the Blue Pacific Continent

Ensure linkages to National level Development Plans are critical to ensure ownership and sustainability



Decent Work in the Circular Economy

Circular jobs are often labour-intensive

Risks: informal work, low pay, hazardous conditions

ILO's approach:

Formalization of circular jobs
OSH standards and social protection
Social dialogue and rights at work





Case Study – ILO STREIT Project – Papua New Guinea

Sustainable Infrastructure

- Works relevant to community priorities
- Type of infrastructure fit for labour-based methods
- Quality design and implementation of works
- Effective contracting arrangements sustainable resourcing
- Sustainable solutions for maintenance and operation
- Sustainability: Ensuring ownership, stimulating demand for goods and services, and supporting productive sectors.

Productive Employment

- Obtaining relevant skills and graduating from the programme
- Reaching out to the most needy
- Reaching targeted groups, i.e. women, youth, disadvantaged groups
- Adhere to OSH and Labour Laws





Case Study: Just Transition in Samoa (Policy Coherence and Integration)

Samoa is part of the Climate Action for Jobs Initiative ILO supported:

- Tripartite social dialogue for Just Transition planning
- Integration of green jobs into employment strategies
- Inclusive participation of women and youth

Circular economy link: Policy coherence across sectors

ILO supports development of National Employment Policies (NEP) in 8 Pacific countries to:

Address youth unemployment and NEET rate
Promote decent work in climate-vulnerable economies
Integrate employment into national development agendas



NEPs include action plans for job creation in green and circular sectors



Future Skills for a Circular Pacific

Key future skills areas:

- Green technical skills: waste auditing, ecodesign, engineering, mechanical
- Soft skills: systems thinking, adaptability
- Entrepreneurial skills: circular business models

ILO supports:

- TVET reform and curriculum development
- Digital and blended learning for remote contexts
- Building and exploring innovative entrepreneurial activities for marginalised groups
