GUIDING PRINCIPLES



Polluter Pay Principle. Each individual living in the Maldives should be responsible for the waste they produce



Each household should manage their waste according to the plans and guideline of the council in which the household is located



Introduction of Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR).

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES





INDIVIDUAL & HOUSEHOLD RESPONSIBILITY



- ► Every individual should be responsible for the waste produced due to their actions
- ► Every household should follow the regulations and guidelines set by the council in reducing and management of waste produced



RESPONSIBILITY OF CLINICS AND HOSPITALS

- Manage medical waste that can be hazardous and infectious
- ► Hospitals and Clinics should manage waste produced by giving necessary support and cooperation to the municipal council it is a part of as well as other institutional regulations




ISLAND LEVEL RESPONSIBILITY

- Prepare and implement an island waste management plan
- Island level waste management plan
- ► Conduct public education sessions.



ISLAND LEVEL RESPONSIBILITY

- Establishment of user pay system
- Regulating and monitoring of waste management under PPP
- Provide waste management statistical data and reports to relevant authorities



ATOLL LEVEL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Ensure proper waste management in all islands
- Identify issues within islands: Resolve with assistance from the island councils



NATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- ► Establish and implement the Waste Management Legal framework
- ► Establish user pay framework including individuals, households, businesses and government institutes under the Solid Waste Management Regulation.
- ► Establish guideline and assist in preparation of Island and Atoll level waste management plan



NATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide necessary waste management infrastructure and equipment for all inhabited islands
- Collections and publication of waste statistics and waste facility inventory
- Conduct regular waste management public education programs and awareness campaigns
- Provide financial and technical assistance for waste management at island level



NATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- ► Allocate regions for waste management and establish RSWMF
- ► R&D
- ► Encourage and promote collaboration between government utility companies and the island councils
- ► Take necessary steps to ensure proper waste management in industrial facilities
- Capacity building in the field of waste management and pollution control












