# Challenges on Urban Transportation system

#### **Management:**


- Old and over dated Traffic laws
- Weak governance for implementation of law and order
- Overlap of responsibilities
   War situation (unplanned traffic barriers and security blockades)

- Low technical, human resource and economical capacity
- Unbalanced development of small and large towns
   Technical transportation problems

# Challenges on Urban Transportation system

#### • Infrastructure

- No traffic lights in the cities
- Narrow urban roads
- Misuse of roads and pedestrians
- inadequate parking
- Slow vehicle's movement
- Lack of mass transport systems; trams, metros, etc.

#### **Planning:**

- Lack of traffic Planning and transportation systems
- Lack of updated urban plans
- Rapid growth of large cities (sudden return of migrants to large urban areas



#### Air Pollution


- Worst quality of fuel particularly diesel,
- 50% Unpaved dusty roads
- Dens traffic


#### **Causes:**

- Over 60% residents of Kabul and large cities are suffering of polluted air
- 150mic.g. small particles / cu. M.
- 120mic.g Nitrogen di oxide / cu. M.
- 20mic.g Sulfur di oxide/ cu. M.



### **Unplanned development of Kabul**







Informal settlements are not just a "problem", but an issue that requires affordable and practical <u>solutions</u>

### Policies approved by Afghan Government:


- Air Pollution Control and Mitigation Regulation

## Urban Sector Strategy (USS)

## Urban infrastructure and services

- This strategy promotes the following transportation infrastructure:
- Upgrading of roads in planned and unplanned areas;
- Rehabilitation and extension of water supply and sanitation services;
- Rehabilitation and extension of new roads and drains;
- Improvement of transportation management.



## Plans and implementation

- New transportation plan for Kabul and major cities
- Comprehensive Traffic plan for Kabul
- Review and updating of Kabul Master plan
- Developing of New Kabul to share the load from existing Kabul
- Decentralization of major activities from center of Kabul





- Creating of new ring roads, bypasses and major artery roads
- Upgrading of: roads and pedestrians, water and Sanitation systems
- Creating new open spaces
- Road lightening
