Bangkok 2020 Declaration

- Cleaner Fuels and Technologies
 - Market share of electric vehicles, hybrid vehicles, and fuel cell vehicles
 - The Green Vehicle Rebate or GVR was introduced in 2001 to minimise the cost differential between green vehicles and their conventional equivalents.
 - However, the current market share of green vehicle remains low, at 8,700 green vehicles as of Dec 2010.
 - To continue supporting vehicle owners in making greener purchases, the existing GVR scheme will be extended until the end 2012 for electric and petrol-electric hybrid vehicles

Bangkok 2020 Declaration

Standards

- Fuel quality standards and the time line for attainment of EURO IV (or equivalent) fuel quality standard
- Diesel vehicles have been on the EURO IV standard since 2006.
- Singapore will adopt EURO V standards for new diesel vehicles with effect from 1 Jan 2014.
- To pave the way for the EURO V standards, Singapore will adopt near sulphur-free diesel (diesel with sulphur content below 10 ppm) with effect from 1 Jul 2013.
- Besides reducing PM2.5 levels, the EURO V standards for diesel vehicles will also reduce other pollutants such as NO₂ and ozone.

Bangkok 2020 Declaration

- Standards
 - Vehicle emission standards for each vehicle class
 - Noise standards for new vehicles were tightened in October 2010
 - Noise standards for existing vehicles was tightened in April 2011.
