
Executive Summary


- Vehicle usage efficiency rate is only 50% in Kathmandu. One of the ways to reduce emissions is by improving the vehicle efficiency usage
- Carpool Kathmandu has ~110K users in a month and half. It has created a subculture and broken down many cultural barriers to ride sharing
- While the platform started amidst fuel crisis, there is a strong indication from the community to continue using the platform even after the fuel crisis eases
- Creative business models and marketing tactics can sustain the ride sharing concept and reduce the total number of private vehicles on street in Kathmandu
- Government policy support will further strengthen ride sharing behavior

At full utilization, estimated number of private vehicles that can reduced by ride-sharing is $7K+^{1}$



During peak time on average ~16K (11.5K motorcycles and 4.5K cars) private vehicles ply on the streets of Kathmandu to transport ~23K passengers (2011) ¹

Carpool Kathmandu – ride sharing platform has broken down existing cultural barriers in ride sharing





- Platform (Facebook group and Android app) to match people who need rides with people who are willing to offer their empty space
- About 110K members in about a month and half
- Members ask for lifts, using #Ask and offers lifts using #Offers, share their experience using #CarpoolStories
- Average of 1,100 Asks and Offers on a daily basis

Carpool Kathmandu members survey indicate a high propensity to continue the ride sharing even after fuel crisis



- Why do you share ride?
 - 17% Environmental reason/ congestion
 - 80% It feels good to help
- Do you think the ride sharing will continue even after fuel crisis?
 - 50% Yes
 - 20% No
 - May be 30%
- Will you continue to ride share even after fuel crisis?
 - 96% Yes
 - 4% No
- On average members rank the platform at 7 (1 being Unsuccessful and 10 being Successful). Members who ranked it lower primarily mentioned the "unnecessary" posts in the platform as the main reason for ranking the platform lower → Increased the number of admins, aggressively deleted posts that did not pertain to carpool

Government policies and economic incentive will strengthen this sub-culture of ride sharing even after fuel crisis



- Validated business models exists to include the compensation model to further strengthen the ride sharing behavior – Uber, BlaBla car etc
 - Business models need to be contextualized for Nepal to be effective and sustainable
- Government policies will further help ride-sharing and reduce pollution and congestion in Kathmandu and elsewhere
 - Designated carpooling station inside the valley
 - High Occupancy Vehicle policies
 - Congestion charges for private cars/ jeeps
 - No vehicles except emergency vehicles in crowded areas
