Field Trip jointly organised by LTA and NEA-Singapore to show/share EST best practices and measures in Singapore

Site Visit 1: Integrated Transport System

Delegates will be driven through the gantries of the Electronic Road Pricing system which is the main instrument for congestion management in Singapore. They will tour the Land Transport Authority's Land Transport Gallery for an overview of Singapore's sustainable and integrated approach to developing a world class transport system. This will be followed by a ride on the driverless underground train and tour of an integrated transport hub where various transport modes and commercial/residential developments are seamlessly integrated both vertically and horizontally. Delegates will also have the opportunity to ride a fully automated light rail system to gain an overview of the integration of public transport within a large residential town.

Site Visit 2: BMW Clean Energy Pavilion

Delegates will tour the BMW Clean Energy Pavilion that showcases liquid hydrogen-powered BMW limousines, along with a mobile liquid hydrogen re-fuelling station. The vehicles will demonstrate our vision of sustainable mobility using this clean energy. Delegates will be given a short presentation by the BMW experts on the new technology and an opportunity to get up close with the vehicles.
